Hi! This is Connie Gerling from the **Wood Place Library!**

The County Commissioners have signed the Order placing the county library district and a levy to operate a county library system on the November 7th ballot.

The Vote YES for Library Services campaign officially kicks-off September 5th. The campaign committee met this week to set a timeline for the campaign.

There are a variety of ways to help with the campaign. You may want to add your name to the many endorser of the campaign that will appear in the newspaper, perhaps you would like a yard sign, or you might be willing to work on the door-to-door portion. And last, but not least, vote on November 7th to establish library services throughout the county for generations to come.

County-wide tax support will allow services to be provided in Jamestown, Clarksburg, Latham, and Highpoint. Services would include children's programming at licensed daycare providers, monthly LEGO programs at schools if allowed, book delivery to Senior Housing and Care facilities, and access eBooks, digital audio books & movies.

Another significant benefit of a successful levy campaign would come from reciprocal borrowing agreements with the Columbia, Jefferson City, Versailles, Eldon, Sedalia, Booneville, and hopefully Tipton, libraries.
